Richard E. Westwood 1992-08 The passage of the 1902 Reclamation Act created a mandate for the federal government to build

dams on the Colorado River and its powerful tributaries. By 1920 the US Geological Survey had surveyed the river's main courses, but still needed accurate charts of the last stretches of deep canyons and white-water rapids, accessible only by boat. *Rough-Water Man* is the first detailed account of these mapping expeditions by the USGS—the San Juan Canyon in 1921, the upper Green River in 1922, and the Grand Canyon in 1923. Illustrated throughout with period photographs, it is also the personal story of twenty-four-year-old Henry Elwyn Blake Jr., the only boatman to crew on each of the three trips, evolving from novice waterman to expert rapids runner. Drawing on Blake's diaries, as well as the writings of other USGS surveyors, *Rough-Water Man* conveys the danger and hardships of navigating these waters with heavy wooden boats and oars. Even today, in rubber pontoons, traversing

these canyons is an awesome and exhilarating experience. When Blake and his companions surveyed it, the Colorado ran free and wild from Wyoming to the Sea of Cortez. Westwood gives us mile-by-mile and day-by-day accounts of running these rapids before their canyons were flooded and waters tamed, before the rivers had ever been charted.

**MARTHA** Paul Penfield 1971 MARTHA is a set of general-purpose programs

for analyzing linear electrical networks, available to users with access to APL time-sharing systems. The programs analyze, as a function of frequency, most linear "transmission-type" networks, with an input and an output. This includes most filters, amplifiers, microwave networks, and feedback systems, even if such circuits are relatively complicated, with multiple feedback paths and branches. The programs cannot handle some complicated interconnections of components, and are not set up to analyze nonlinear or time varying networks. The topology of the network is described using "wiring operators." The elements available include lumped and distributed, active and passive, reciprocal and nonreciprocal elements. The possible output includes tow-port parameters (impedance, admittance, hybrid, scattering, and

ABCD matrices), as well as voltage gain, insertion gain, transducer gain, etc. These, their real or imaginary parts, or magnitude or phase, may be printed or plotted as functions of frequency or of each other. More than one network can be analyzed simultaneously. MARTHA is not inherently better at one frequency range than another, except perhaps in its repertoire of elements and response functions. MARTHA includes, besides R, L, and C, sixteen controlled sources; operational amplifiers; mutual inductance; three transistor models and the possibility of easily creating others; ideal transformers; several composite pi and tee structures; and a few exotic elements such as gyrators. For high-frequency applications MARTHA has several microwave elements, including TEM transmission lines, waveguides, attenuators, and isolators.

1993-03-01 When HMS  
Challenger sailed from  
Portsmouth in 1872, a  
young assistant ship's  
steward, Joseph Matkin,  
was among the crew.  
Throughout the three-and-a-  
half-year voyage, Matkin  
maintained a journal from  
which he composed the  
many letters he sent home  
to his family in England. In  
his letters he commented on  
oceanographic operations,  
reported on shipboard  
events of special concern to  
the crew, and discussed at  
length the history,  
geography, and peoples of  
the many exotic and remote  
ports at which the ship

called on its famous circumnavigation of the globe. The Challenger expedition established the foundations of oceanography and is second only to Darwin's voyage aboard the Beagle for its contributions to nineteenth-century science. The massive quantity of specimens and information acquired was written up in the fifty-volume series of Challenger Reports, and personal accounts were published by officers and scientists. No ocean voyage had ever been so well documented. Yet no account of the seaman's life "below decks" was known to exist until the early 1980s, when two substantial collections of Matkin's letters surfaced. The letters are unique in their perspective and fascinating for their depth and literacy. Matkin, the son of a printer, was well aware of the significance of the voyage and strove to present a learned account in a proper style. His letters

convey a wealth of detail about shipboard logistics, the crew's attitudes toward scientific operations, and officer-scientist-crew relations. Unwittingly, Matkin also illuminates himself and the middle-class society of which he was a part. Matkin's letters, published here for the first time, bring freshness and immediacy to this great Victorian scientific enterprise. Philip F.
